Killdeer (*Charadrius vociferus*) - Fields and barren areas, often far from water. Now occasionally nests on flat gravel rooftops.

American Oystercatcher (*Haematopus palliatus*) - Three records: One was seen and photographed on 4/2/1993 at Beltzville SP, *Carbon*, (PB 7:51). One on 9/19/2003 at Dunnings Creek, *Bedford* and 9/19/2003 Nockamixon SP, *Bucks* were associated with Hurricane Isabel (PB 17:281)

Black-necked Stilt (*Himantopus mexicanus*) - At least 14 records, all but two between 1961 and 1996, none since. Bred in Philadelphia 1989 and possibly 1988 as well, although no young fledged (PB 3:79 and 3:114). One fall record from Glenolden, *Delaware*, 9/28/1938 (Poole 1964).

American Avocet (*Recurvirostra americana*) - Mudflats. At least 26 records from PISP, nearly all late summer or fall, and at least 60 more from rest of Pa.

Greater Yellowlegs (*Tringa melanoleuca*) - Mudflats, lake and pond edges, creeks, and flooded pastures and fields.

Lesser Yellowlegs (*Tringa flavipes*) - Mudflats, lake and pond edges, and flooded pastures and fields. Two winter records: 2/7/1998 in the Amish farm area, *Lancaster* (PB 12:14); 4 present up to 1/10/1998 at the Army Corps area, *Philadelphia* (PB 12:14).

Solitary Sandpiper (*Tringa solitaria*) - Lake and pond edges, creeks, flooded fields, and mudflats.

Willet (*Catoptrophorus semipalmatus*) - Mudflats, lake edges, and wet fields. The few birds identified to subspecies have been western form.

Spotted Sandpiper (*Actitis macularius*) - Lake, pond and river edges, mudflats, flooded fields, and creeks. One winter record: 2/23-3/3/2002 at Lake Perez, *Huntington*, on (PB 16:16).
